We approach global perspective in a number of different ways. Some academic years see us promoting international aid work, others integrating worldwide issues such as migration and immigration into the curriculum.

Last year we held a Spanish-themed day, when pupils got to experience the wider culture of the country, to enhance the teaching of Spanish as a language within school.

As a school, we always celebrate Fairtrade Fortnight. This year online learning related to Fairtrade Fortnight was undertaken by Year 6 during lockdown. Once school re-opened, Year 2 had a dedicated Fairtrade Day, in which they baked using Fairtrade ingredients and completed activities to raise their awareness of the importance of fairer trade to improve the livelihoods of people and communities around the world by making farming viable.

Another constant in our delivery of a curriculum based upon British Values is to teach children about worldwide religious celebrations and beliefs in order to foster mutual respect.

In 2021 we turned World Book Day into a global affair by basing activities around the book 'Mother Earth is Weeping' by Claire Donald. The story explained how many people around the world are displaced and taught children about imbalances in the distribution of wealth and resources around the world.

As part of the curriculum, children listen to, appraise and perform music from around the world including Hip Hop, Reggae, Classical, Rock, World, Folk, Electronic, Rap, Soul, Pop, Blues, Baroque, Latin, Bhangra, Funk, Bossa Nova, Classical/Film, Big Band Jazz, House and Classic Swing Music.

We celebrate the Christian festivals of Easter and Christmas and we share the Muslim celebration of Eid.

Throughout the school year, we raise money for a range of charities. These include local, national and international charities such as Oldham Foodbank, The British Legion Poppy Appeal, Children in Need, MacMillans and Young Minds.
