Forest School, Eco Club

Last year saw the use of our school grounds maximized through the delivery of Forest School sessions on site as two of our staff members completed Level 3 Forest School Practitioner qualifications. The impact of this is not only to use our natural space to enhance learning and wellbeing but also to promote a sustainable relationship with nature. As a result of the training, we have a working environmental impact assessment on the running of forest schools on our site which protects and conserves the environment and its flora and fauna.

Aside from Forest School, children use and develop the outdoor environment in Eco Club. Last year, club members started to develop a sensory garden within school. This year a new woodland copse was planted and a whole school Eco Day is planned for the Summer, to include a Bioblitz activity to identify biodiversity.
