Entrance to school

In September, Nursery and Reception will enter via the Early Years gate and will be met by their class teacher. Years 1, 5 and 6 will enter via their classroom door. Years 2, 3 and 4 will enter via the Key Stage 2 doors on the small playgorund. This is instead of the canopy doors.
